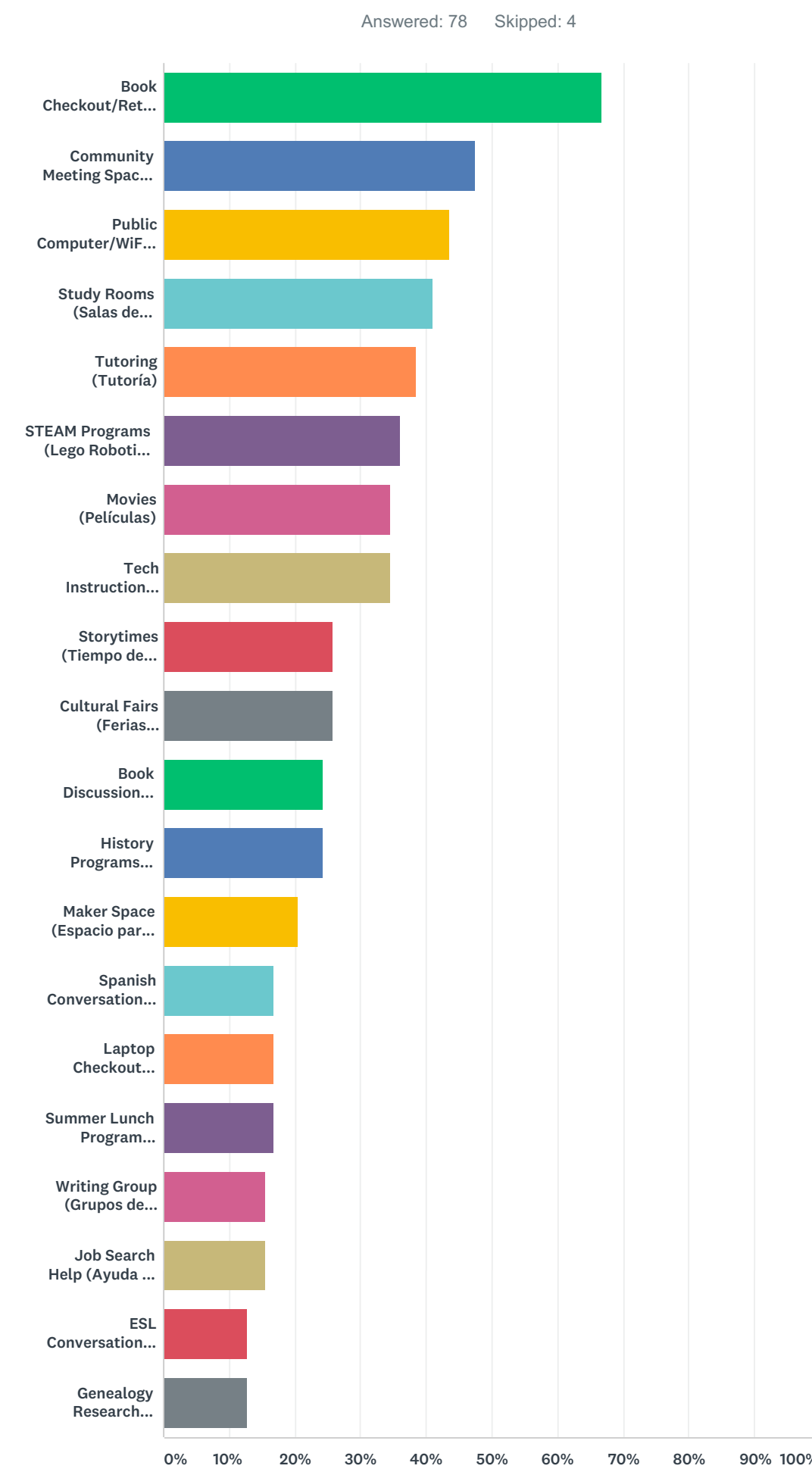

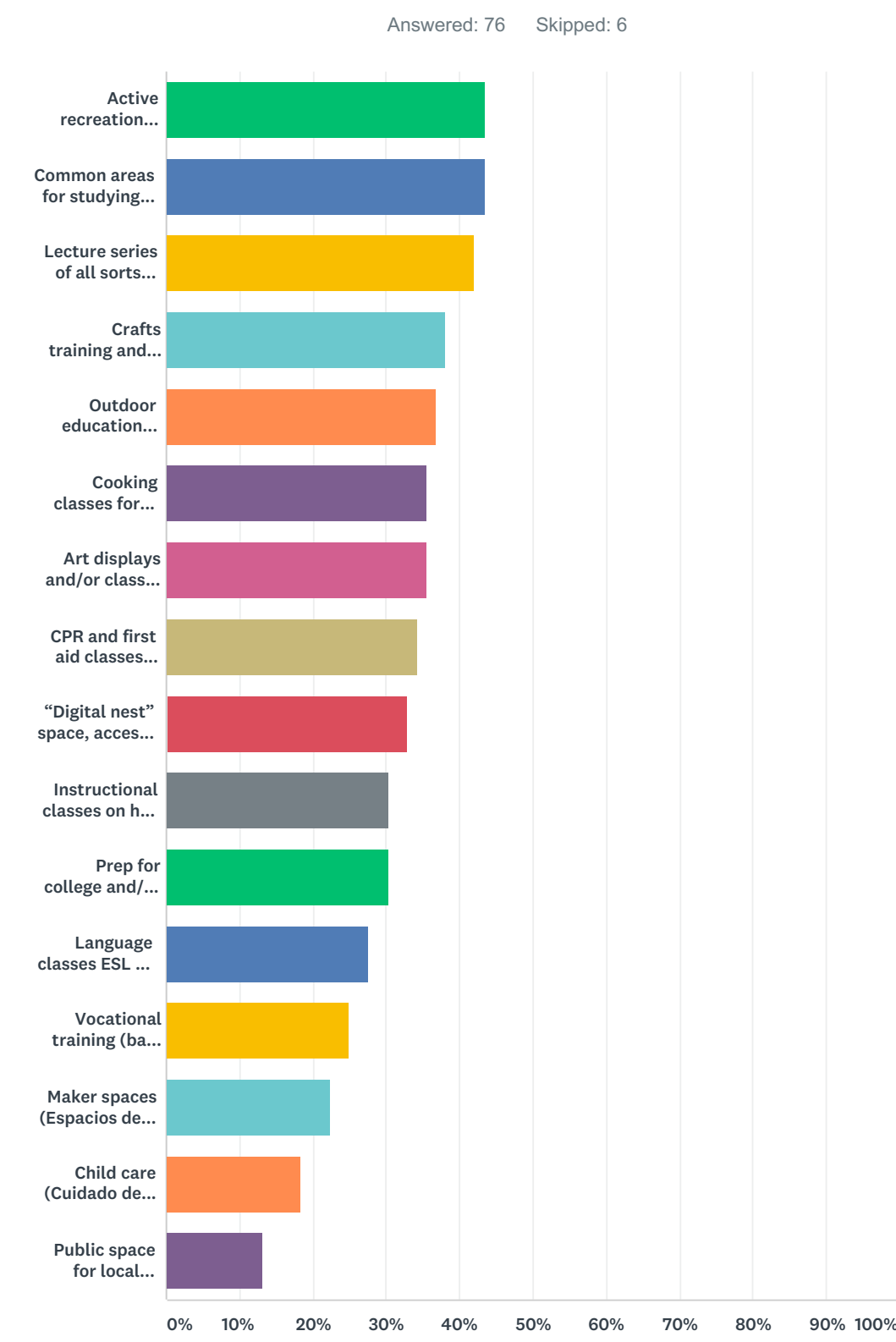

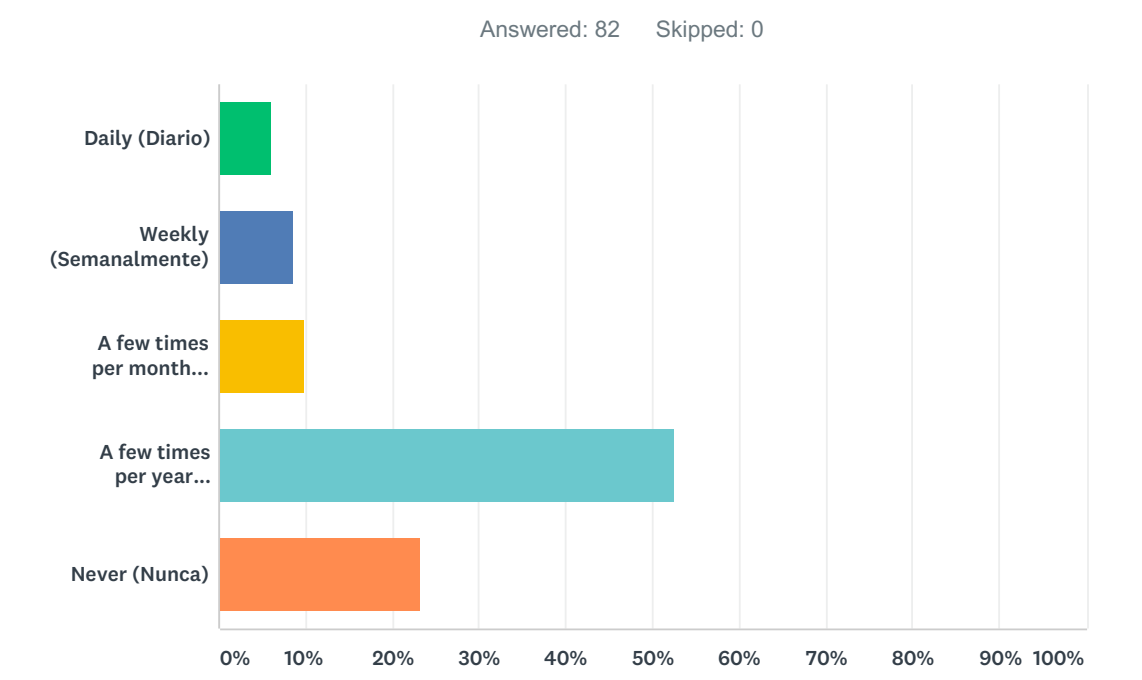

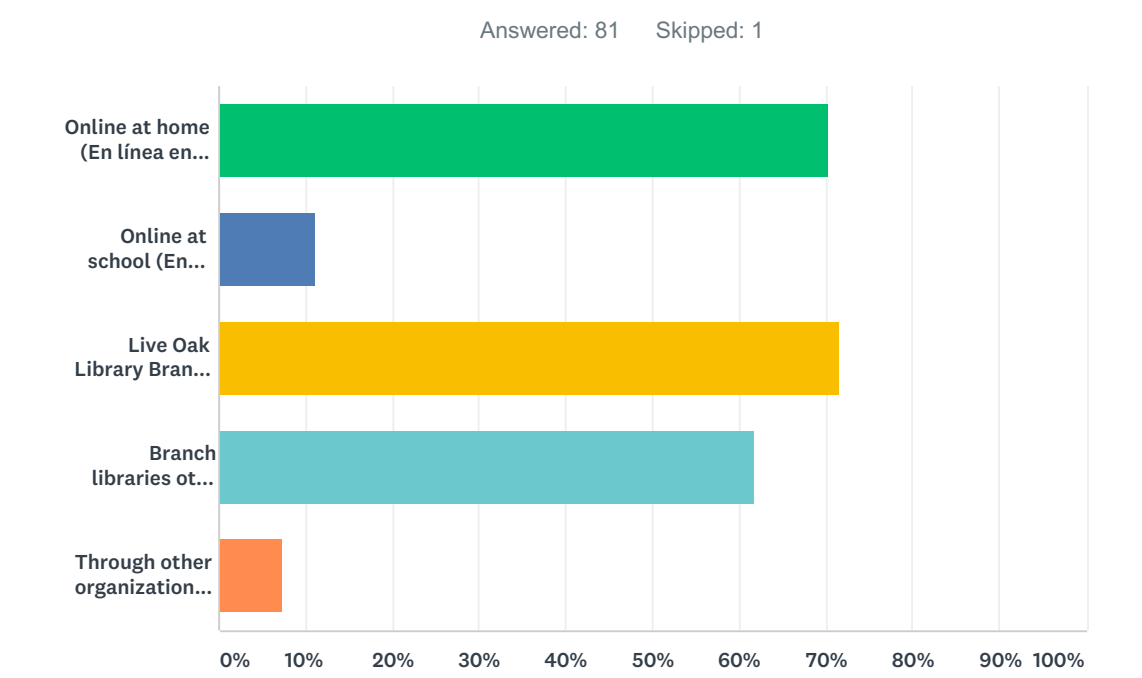

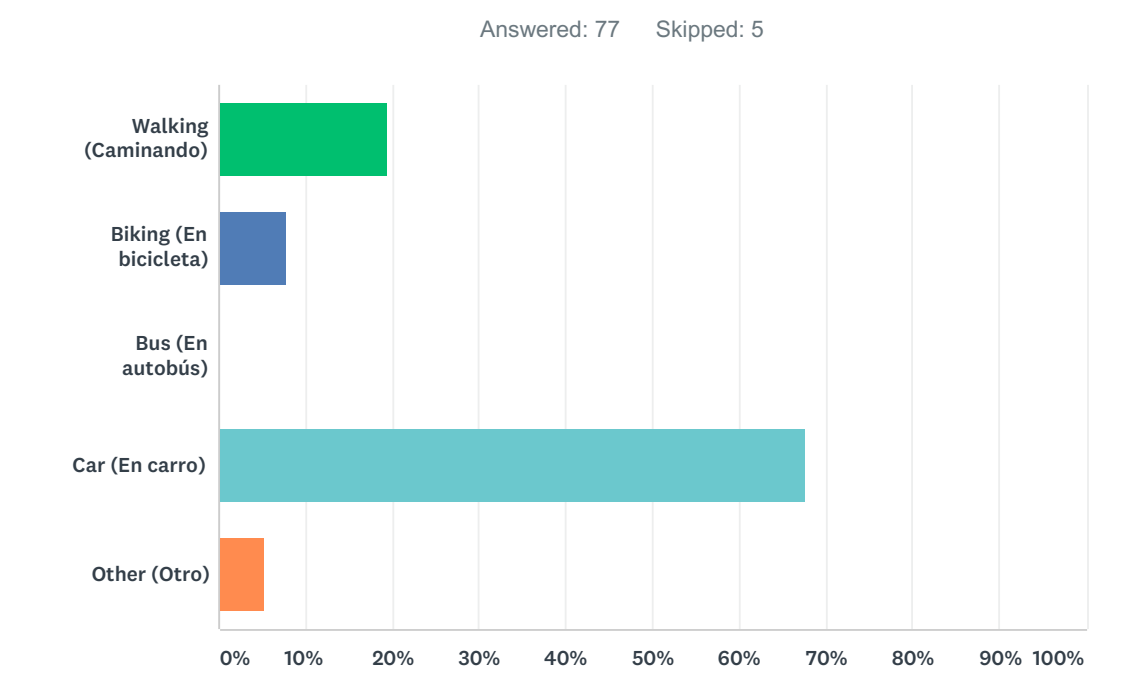

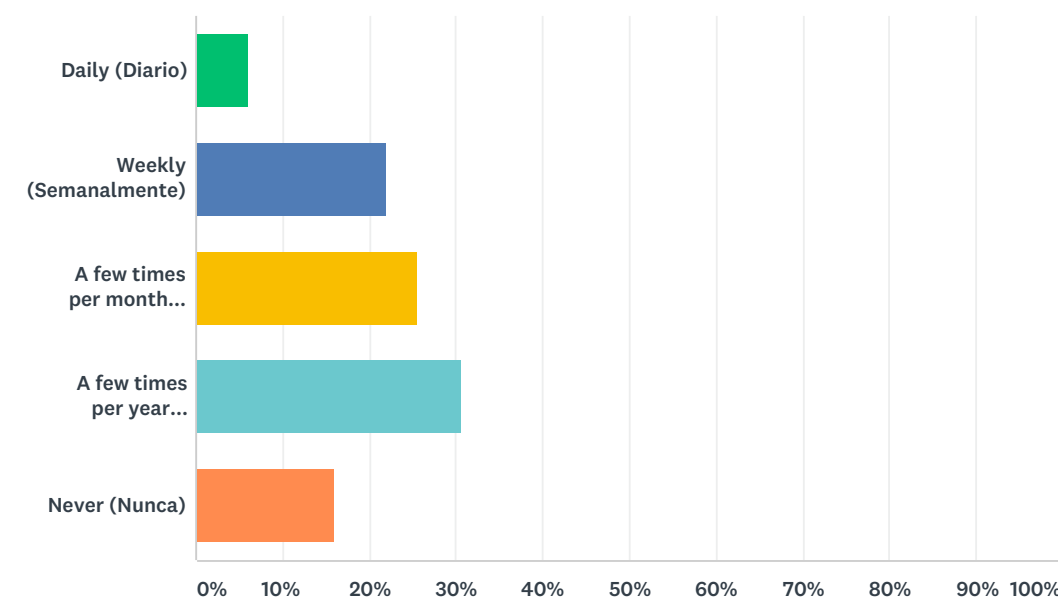
Q6 How do you get to the Simpkins Swim Center and Community Center? (¿Cómo llega al centro de natación Simpkins y al centro comunitario?)

Q7 How often do you visit the Live Oak Library Branch? (¿Con qué frecuencia visita la sucursal de la biblioteca de Live Oak?)

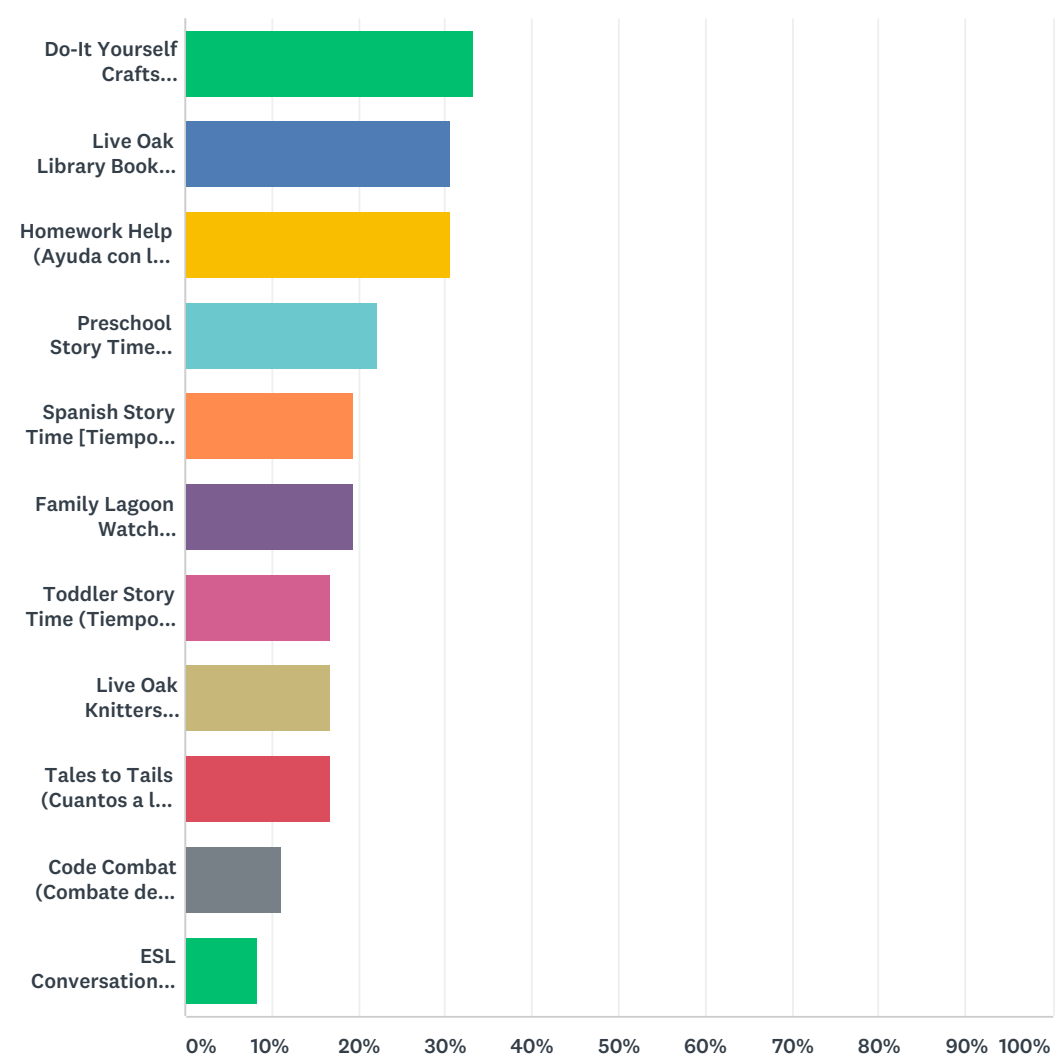

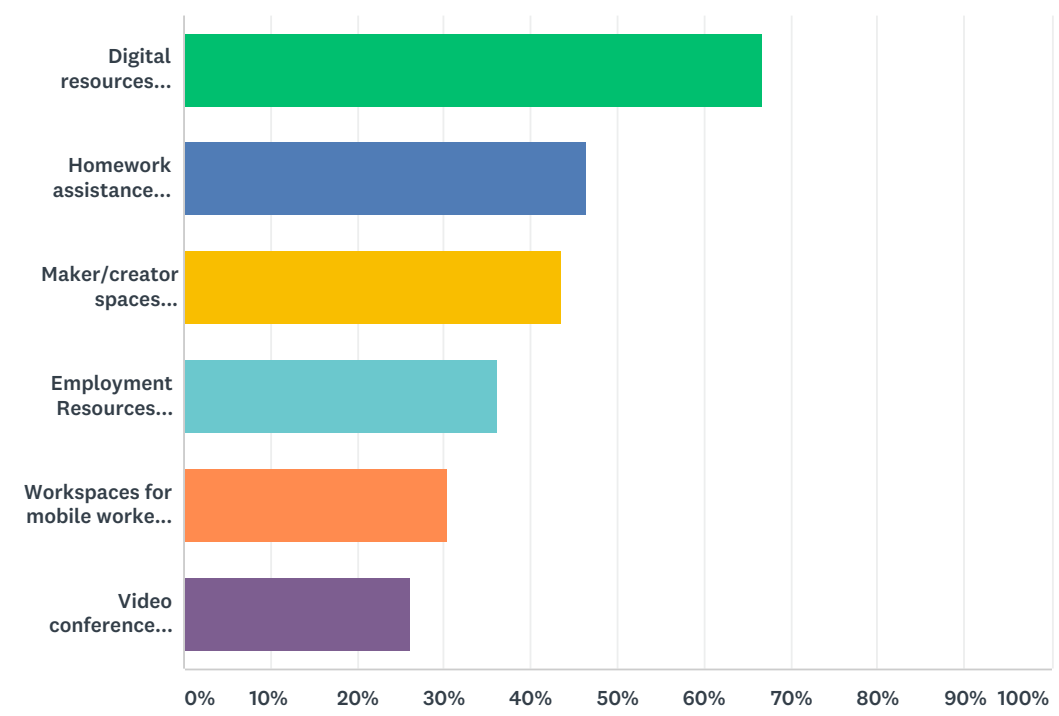

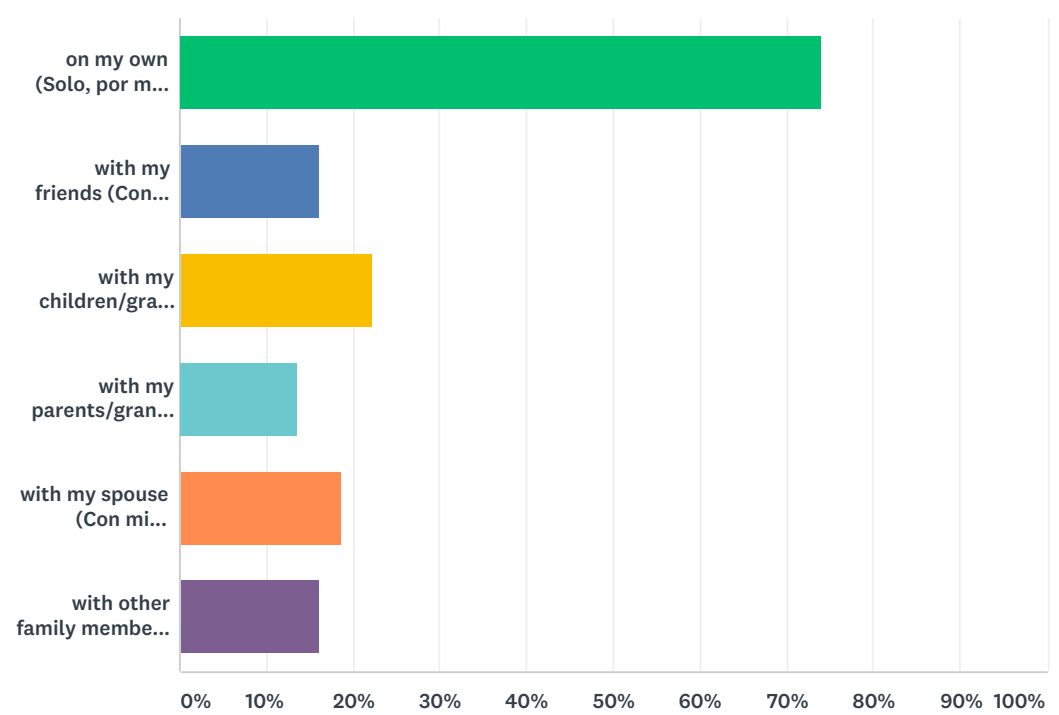

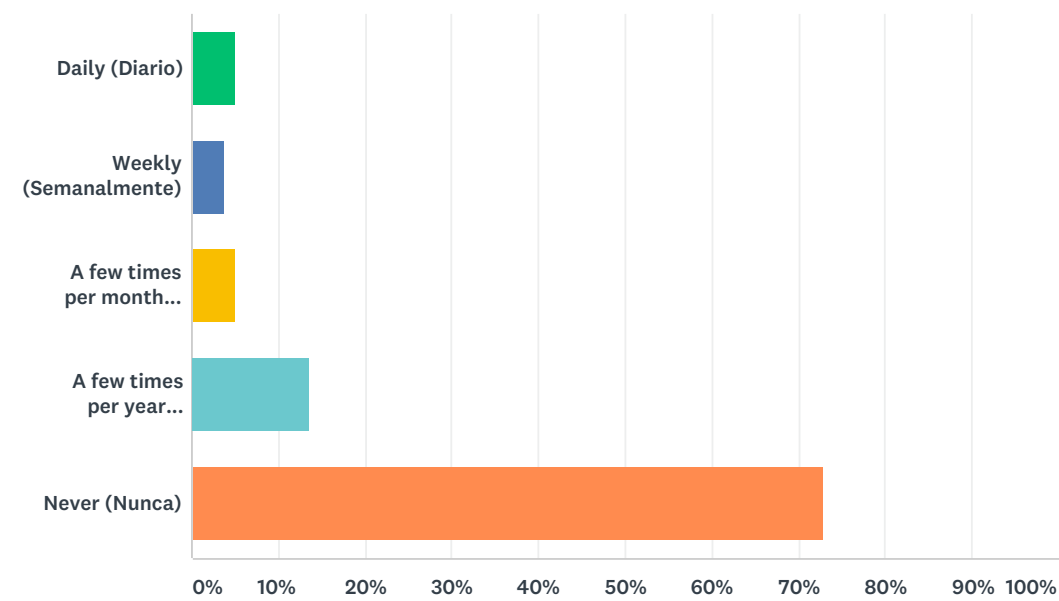

33	90% of the proposed activities have little to nothing to do with a library's purpose. A library is not a day care center, a job training site, a gym. If the community wants or needs a community center beyond those that already exist very near this location, they should not be using Measure S funds, which should go to improve the Live Oak branch the newest branch in the system. This "annex" should never have been approved by the Board of Supes, JPA or the library director.
34	I would like to see youth programs offered at this branch that are currently offered at other branches. The Live Oak community struggles with transportation, it is not feasible for many families to travel to Felton, Aptos, or La Selva Beach so that their children may participate in the enrichment activities offered there.
35	Services and resources designed based on the needs of the Latino and low income and homeless populations - child care, ESL, tutoring and mentoring for computer skills, getting access to human services, health care services, and other.
